Reunion Update

The fourth annual Family and Friends of the 508th PIR Assn. reunion will be held in Oklahoma City from October 20 – October 24. The reunion coincides with the 68th Anniversary of the activation date of the regiment on October 20, 1942.

We will be hosted by the WWII Airborne Demonstration Team of Frederick, OK. The ADT have lots of fun things planned for us including a parachute jump and C-47 ride-alongs.

Floyd Haynes and His Orchestra will be playing for your dancing and listening entertainment at the banquet.

The reunion will also include a visit to the Oklahoma City National Memorial; a very moving tribute to the victims of the 1995 bombing there. Truly a "must see". We will also visit the 45th Infantry Division Museum.

Other places of interest are the National Cowboy Museum and the Museum of Women Pilots. Historic Brick Town, Oklahoma City's premier entertainment district, is a mere two blocks from our hotel. Attractions include many restaurants, canal rides, and more.

CSM Bert Puckett has graciously agreed to attend and be our speaker. Those of you who attended the 2008 Reunion at Ft. Bragg will remember what a wonderful job CSM Puckett did of hosting us and what a dynamic speaker he is.

Normandy Remembered

Paul Demciak of B Co. sent the following:

"I, Paul Demciak, was a member of the 1st Btn Pathfinder team. I jumped into Normandy the night of 5 June 44. I landed in the 101st area and after about twenty hours of combat, I was wounded and captured by the German SS troops along with several 501st PIR paratroopers. I was a POW for 3 months. We were force marched from Normandy to Toulouse in Southern France.

On 6 September, I and eight other G.I.s escaped to Naples, Italy with the help of English intelligence MI5, American OSS, and the French underground. We escaped in a Dakota C-47. I received 3 Purple Hearts and 2 Bronze Star Medals with a (V) device."

In 2009, Paul was awarded the Legion of Honor with the rank of "Chevalier" by the French government for his part in the liberation of France. The Legion of Honor was created by Napoleon in 1802 and is the highest honor the French can bestow on a non-Frenchman. All Americans who fought in France are entitled to this honor.

Message from the President

I was introduced to the 508PIR Association in 1994. My Mom and Dad were hosting a Headquarters Company, C Company mini-reunion. I had recently learned of my dad's participation in the 508 and was very interested in learning more. I attended a couple of mini reunions until dad's death in 1998. After that, my family came together, I have five sisters and one brother, and we would accompany mom to subsequent reunions.

In 2004, I attended my first regimental reunion, the retirement ceremony of the 508PIR Association. It was a life changing experience. My journey had just begun but was seemingly ending. About six months later, I received an e-mail from George Stoeckert, stating he was planning a mini-reunion in Orange Park, Florida, October 2005.

At this reunion, I met Dick O'Donnell and learned of his idea to form the Family and Friends of the 508PIR Association. His idea was met with; I will put it nicely, "mixed reviews".

Another idea was proposed at this time which was questioned, especially by me, the idea to have a celebration honoring the activation of the 508 and including all era's of the regiment. These factors shaped my involvement with the 508 PIR.

The retirement of the 508 PIR Association was an incredible event. It was run perfectly and attendance was unmatched. I met a multitude of wonderful people, many I had read about in books on the 508 and had a great time but could not stop thinking; I did not want this to end. My reunion ended with my friend Joe Bressler and me sharing a beer sitting on the back of his car reminiscing about my dad and the day's events. It was a long, lonely, somber drive home. I was unable to cope with the fact that I may never have a chance to see these people again. The 508 PIR Association meant so much to my Mom, Dad and me and its role in my life was changing.

In Orange Park, Florida, 2005, I met O'Donnell. webmaster of www.508PIR.org website. Dick proposed the formation of a new 508 PIR Association. He was met with strong criticism and I was unsure if I should get involved but I knew I wanted reunions to continue. I polled attendee's and received many different views. A couple of conversations solidified my choice to get involved. I attended a couple of planning meetings with Dick and others to get a new association off the ground. I hosted the first Family and Friends of the 508 PIR Association reunions in Augusta, Georgia 2006. I had gone from trying to find out more about my dad to falling in love with the 508 family. I was now hooked.

In 2008, at the third annual Family and Friends of the 508PIR reunion, in Fayetteville North Carolina, The idea of having all generations of the 508 celebrating the activation of the regiment came to fruition. During the reunion, our by-laws were amended to allow all generations of the 508 into our association. At first, I was not for this

change. I got involved with the 508 because of my dad and remained a part because of the friendships made with the friends and families of the WWII veterans. This changed on a trip to the 82nd Airborne museum.

My wife and I, along with a couple of young 508 soldiers were watching a video showing pictures of soldiers lost in battle and I saw the reaction of a couple of the soldiers, one in particular. I was moved beyond words; the look and actions of this young man stirred my soul and I realized how important the 508PIR association had been for my dad. I knew it was important to continue and include all 508 veterans. The 508PIR association transformed the life of my dad. He changed from a battle hardened man, running from the demons of war to a proud, happy, patriotic, paratrooper. He died at peace, proud of his participation in WWII and even prouder of the men he served with.

I am very proud to be the president of the Family and Friends of the 508 PIR Association and although I feel unworthy to have such an important job; I will be a member for life. I have seen many people come to reunions, as I once did, on a journey to find out more about a friend or family member, only to fall off after a couple of years.

My journey took a much unexpected path. I have learned a lot about my dad and myself and I am very proud of lessons learned. More importantly I have made some lifelong friends. We are all connected by a common goal, to honor the 508 PIR.

I am proud of our association and how we have embraced other generations of the regiment. I am glad some of these veterans have become a part of our beloved association and are attending reunions. I hope that some of you feel as strongly as I do and will help us to continue in perpetuity.
