Another All American Week has come and gone, and as usual, it was superb. The Division rolled out the red carpet for the over 950 veteran's , family members and guests.




Actually there is quite a story about that event starting in Germany and ending at Camp Kilmer when we were finally told the Regiment was to be deactivated. They lied to us in Germany and said we were to join the 82nd at Bragg as a regiment. Instead, they deactivated us and sent the Airborne to fill the ranks of the other regiments at Bragg. We were a small detachment, most of the ship carried straight legs. The rest of the Regiment came home later.

I was shipped to California for discharge. Too bad for me because my sweetheart lived in Rockingham, NC and we were to be married. I never returned to NC, I finished high school and college, two marriages later I'm single (but happy with three grown children). But my memory of my first sweetheart is still fresh in my mind as is my memory of the lie to us in Germany that is not very pleasant to recall. Many of the 508th troopers stationed in Germany had a golden opportunity to stay (with a promotion) in Germany with the Constabulary, a new outfit which needed men badly. But most of us remained loyal to the Regiment and Division. I may decide to tape a story about the Regiment and the event if you think it is worth while.




