1SG, Ret. Stanley A. Freiling (D/55-56) writes: I don't have orders or other military records due to the fire at the Records Center in St. Louis. I am an active member of the 101st Airborne Division Association. If you have access to the morning reports of Co. D, 508th ARCT in Camp Wood, Kumomoto, Japan in 1955-56 you will find my name therein.

I came back from Japan in 1956 and was at Fort Campbell for the reactivation of the 101st. We wore the Red Devil patch on the left pocket of the fatigue uniform. I was threatened, along with others, to remove the patch or get an Article 15. The esprit de corps and comradeship ran deep with the 508th and accepting the eagle patch was not easy for many of us Red Devils.

I served with all the airborne units at one time or the other beginning with the 11th Airborne Division under MG Wayne C. Smith. I went on to serve with the 508th in Japan, the 509th in Germany, the 1st Air Cavalry Division, which was airborne for only one year (1965-66) in Vietnam, the 173d in Vietnam and of course the 101st for nine years (1956-1965). I met and made some great friendships in the 508th and would greatly like to see there men once again in my lifetime. Sincerely, Stanley Frieling **Tom Measles** (598/51-56) writes: Jack, Reference is made to the article in "Down Memory Lane" in a previous newsletter concerning the February 1956 SEATO Operation in Bangkok, Thailand. The 2d Platoon, 598th Airborne Engineer Company was also a part of the ABCT. We also made the jump there.

We left Japan with two inches of snow on the ground and the day we made the jump in Bangkok it was 105 degrees on the DZ. The engineers provided potable water for the ABCT along with other engineer duties as needed. Just looking out for the Engineers! Tom Measles

Down Memory Lane

508th ARCT by Bob Murray (B/51-53)

June 1951 was a milestone in the history of the Red Devils. Four weeks prior to the 1st of June the 508th PIR of WWII fame celebrated their reactivation on Saturday the 5th of May, on the parade field of the 504th AIR of the 82d Airborne Division. COL Joseph P. Cleland, the "Great White Father" and former CO of the 504th AIR assumed command of the 508th AIR. COL Roy E. Lindquist, former WWII commander of the 508th PIR, and 1SG Leonard Funk, Medal of Honor holder and the most decorated paratrooper of WWII, were among the dignitaries present.

The following morning the first contingent of young enlistees and draftees, who had received their basic training with the 82d, and volunteered for the Airborne, boarded trains for the journey to Fort Benning, GA. There they would train to jump from an aircraft in flight, win those parachute wings and get a pair of Corcoran Jump Boots to spend may an hour spit shining.

The first group was followed by the remainder of volunteers who had trained with the Division in two successive weeks. The first group completed Jump School June1, left immediately for Sand Hill, the new home of the Red Devils. They formed the First

Battalion and sent some to H&H, Support, Service and Medical Companies. As a new unit the 508th had many specialty slots to fill, cooks, medics, mechanics, clerks, communications, rigger, etc. Many were assigned, along with those who volunteered, to training schools all over the country-Virginia, Texas, California, Alabama, Oklahoma etc. Some of these courses lasted sixteen or more weeks to qualify them in their specialties.

Those who remained were in the line companies, training night and day, day in and day out, humping all over Georgia in the heat and humidity from Monday thru noon Saturday. They then washed their faces, shined their boots and headed for Columbus, crossed over the bridge to soak up countless beers in Phenix City, and then get those beautiful parachute wings tattooed on their forearms to let everyone know they were an American Paratrooper....until they got home and tried to hide it so Mom wouldn't see it. Then, if they had any cash left and got lucky, they would then be ripped off by one of those loverly local beauties

Ah, the sweet joy of youth. Would you, or could you relive those sweet moments sublime?

Chapter Elections - August 2003

As indicated in previous issues the Chapter elections for Chapter Officers for the years 2004-05 will be held at the 82d National Convention in Charleston, WV. To date no one has expressed an interest in volunteering to keep the Chapter alive. Below is a very brief outline of duties of each officer.

Chairman - Plans and coordinates Chapter activities and overall administration of the chapter. Writes the Chairman's Column for the Chapter newsletter and the Paraglide.

Vice Chairman - Assumes the duties of the Chairman in his absence. Coordinates all recruiting functions. Coordinates with the Secretary to ensure all contacts are forward to the Secretary for inclusion in the Chapter Data Base.

Treasurer - Receives all applications for chapter membership. Continued on page 6.

Records applications and forwards appropriate applications and funds to National. Coordinates with Secretary to insure proper membership status is posted to the data base. Continues on page 6. Records all funds received and disbursed on the monthly chapter records and furnishes a copy of such monthly records at the end of each month to the Chairman. Completes annual financial report due to National and forwards such report to the Chairman for his perusal and signature.

Secretary - Is the official recorder of all data pertaining to the chapter and maintains the Chapter Data Base. Answers all inquires pertaining to membership. Mails information letters and complimentary newsletters to newly found Red Devils. Produces welcome letter for all new applicants for Chairman's signature and forwards with appropriate documents. Receives requests for unit rosters, produces said, and forwards funds to the Treasurer to be recorded in the monthly financial record.

Provides mailing labels to Editor of the newsletter.

Quartermaster - Contacts local businesses to produce chapter quartermaster items. Forwards completed items to chapter members. Maintains appropriate financial records and forwards records monthly along with funds to the Treasurer.

Newsletter Editor - Responsible for the production and distribution of the bi-monthly newsletter and up dating of the chapter web site. This position could be a Vice Chairman's position or non- officer position.

It is highly recommended that all officers and the editor of the newsletter have good working computers and able to communicate with each other. Don't forget this in a National Chapter and communications is a <u>MAJOR</u>, <u>MAJOR</u>

PROBLEM, not only with chapter members but between chapter officers as well!

Did You Know?

The Department of Defense is studying the use of a digitized bugle to render taps at veterans' military funerals. It consists of a standard bugle that has a special electronic device inserted into its bell.

DoD has shipped 50 of them to military units and veterans' groups in Missouri for six months' testing, said DoD adviser Mark Ward. "This is a real bugle," Ward emphasized. In normal use, the audience can't see the device – and if it's removed, the bugle becomes standard issue. "The device has a volume control and is powered by two nine-volt batteries. It is water-resistant and usable in all types of weather." The digital unit won't replace trained buglers, but it is an alternative to the audio tapes and compact discs that have been used at many military funerals in recent years.
