82ND CONVENTION ST LOUIS 2008 By Ken Hamill

We arrived in St Louis around 12 Noon Monday. Gas was \$3.45, fifty cents a gallon cheaper there than our last stop in Illinois. The Millenium Hotel had everything needed for a good reunion. Our room was small but adequate and had a coffee maker. The 4th Street Grill located one floor below the lobby had a \$13 morning buffet with free coffee to go. We walked a couple hundred yards to Gateway Arch Park and the Mississippi River. Very nice with shade trees, benches and lots of tourists. We tried the hotel Top of the Riverfront Revolving Restaurant for dinner. had a spectacular 360 degree view. Their special was a three course; choose one item out of four offered for each course at \$25 a head. My gal Bonnie explained the menu and helped me order. It was excellent. We stopped by a busy and expensive Martini's Lounge on the lobby floor for a coffee royal after dinner. On Tuesday we caught buses at 10:00 AM to Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery. Chairs

had been placed under a shade canopy adjacent to the Gateway Chapter Memorial Site. beautiful floral wreath in the form of an 82nd airborne patch was displayed. Chaplain Goff of the 82nd spoke. WWII vets laid the wreath at the Memorial. It was a nice ceremony. We caught our buses to the parade field / drop zone where a nice picnic area was set up. Cold beer, hamburgers and brats hit the spot. Fifteen sky divers jumped from a C-47 using steerable chutes. All were great paratroopers. The most notable was Dana Bowman. He had a mid air collision in 1994 with another jumper while in the Golden Knights and lost both legs. He is back jumping again and is also a dynamic speaker. The buses had us back at the hotel by 2:00 PM. We chatted with several people at Martini's Lounge, then looked around the downtown area and had dinner at a nice place called Callico's. We toured on Wednesday. The buses took us to Riverboat Dock where we boarded and cruised on the Tom Sawyer and saw barge traffic, docks, downtown St Louis...Continued on Page 2

... and the mighty Mississippi. The buses then took us to Anheuser Busch where they briefed us and showed us their brewery. Our last stop there was the Tap Room where we were offered free beer and pretzels. We returned to the hotel and visited the hospitality room. This great room with its very nice volunteers gave us any kind of drink we wanted and pizza to quell the appetite. We met old and new friends and several great young paratroopers who had just returned from a 15 month tour in Afghanistan. We visited the 508 PIR Suite and met several paratroopers including CSM Flowers. We were invited to join the group and we did - hot dogs, potato salad and wine were good and free. We caught buses on Thursday to an airport / base 30 minutes' east in Illinois. Several hundred, perhaps thousands watched the 82nd jump. Two C-130 aircraft dropped 114 jumpers on three passes over the short DZ. Several paratroopers landed on the concrete runway, but none were seriously hurt. Great fun and we were back at the hotel by 1:00 The Chapter Officers Meeting started at 2:00 PM. Executive Director De Jesus did most of the briefing - Membership now 34,000; Chairman & Treasurer of each Chapter is bonded by National; We were invited to go to unit hospitality suites: Concerns were - Inform delinquent members, changes of address and promoting communication with deployed units. The hospitality room really had a great spread for everyone. BBQ chicken, ham, beef, potato salad, beans and cole slaw. The 508 PIR suite was one of three suites where the approximately 700 paratroopers ate their meals. Breakfast. lunch and supper through late night snacks with free drinks were offered and we were welcome to join in. This was an NCO operation. The Sergeants Major and other NCO's silently supervised and maintained a good hearted and friendly atmosphere. Officers were not seen, except at the social functions in the hospitality room. I asked CSM Flowers to help me present a gift from our Chapter to Ken Glynn and he assembled us on the deck. I explained to the group how our Chapter had sent \$7763.00 to Ken Glynn and the Orlando Chapter and they had bought, packaged and sent great items to Chaplain Pundt for our paratroopers. 508 PIR

CSM Flowers presented Ken with our Chapter gift, a small brass paratrooper mounted on a small plague. The Friday Delegates Meeting started at 8:00. The Cleveland Chapter told of their presenting certificates to the family of deceased veterans at funerals. Some vets want credit cards to be allowed at 82nd National Sales. We adjourned at 8:45. Bonnie and I took the tram to the top of the Arch at \$10 a head and saw a great Lewis & Clark movie there too. The Memorial Banquet started at 7:00 PM. The 82nd Chaplain spoke, followed by Ron Rath who recognized Airborne Unit KIA's in all wars. The meal was OK and the atmosphere was special. The hospitality room opened soon after the banquet for music and dancing. The band was very good and their lead singer imitated a few entertainers including Elvis. old Membership Meeting on Saturday started at 1:00 as follows - Invocation, Pledge of Allegiance, Recognize Distinguished Audience Members, Roll Call of Directors, Bylaws Change Briefing, Introduction of Director Candidates, Voting Procedure Briefing, Conduct the Vote and Awards Presentation. Chapters with increased memberships were recognized with a very nice plaque. Communications awards were given to El Paso #1. North Jersev #2 and 508 Chapter #3 for our Newsletter. The \$25 award check was sent to our Treasurer. Chapter congratulations go to the elected Directors - Rich Becker, Chet Cassidy, Ray Guzman, Ken Ray, Alan Schoppe and Ed Herlihy. The National Heritage Day Banquet that evening went like clockwork. Good food and camaraderie. Steve Frazer should be congratulated; he has good stage presence and keeps to the schedule. 

MEMORIES OF A PARATROOPER By Dave Compton

The 3rd Bn, 508th Airborne was alive and active when I was in Panama in 1966. I know as I made 6 jumps there. We wore the Dragon patch. Our B Company Commander said the Battalion Commander wouldn't wear the 193rd leg patch. I never saw any officers from the 193rd. For 10-11 months in Panama it was a fun ride. Along with our normal training, we were the aggressor force from time to time at the Jungle Warfare School that Special Forces ran on the Atlantic side to train troops and officers from various South & Central American countries. We also did military funerals and honor guard for the USARSO Commanding General. One of our training exercises was to go out on the Canal at night and make like Marines up the coast, assaulting in the AM. The seas were rough and there was a lot of bitching as we hit the shore about why we didn't just jump! That was our only experiment with being Marines. That's why the Airborne will always be above the rest and the Marines can go float in their boats! When President Johnson went to a Latin American Summit in Paraguay or maybe Uruguay, B Company, 508th became a ready reaction force. Concertina wire defined the Marshalling Area perimeter and we were confined to our barracks The Air Force sent down C-130's and we loaded them with our parachutes, food, ammo, etc. and were ready to deploy if anything happened, which it didn't. Several of us Red Devils were ordered to join the 101st at Fort Campbell. We then shipped out with 11,000 paratroopers of the 2nd and 3rd Brigades on Operation Eagle Lift to Vietnam. Westmoreland had commanded the 101st state side and wanted his old division to join the 1st brigade in country. I was a paratrooper in the 101st when the Legs in Washington decided to make the 101st Air Cavalry then Air Mobile. It was a bummer being Airborne in a leg unit. With the casualty count high in the 173rd and 101st, the Army was probably having trouble just replacing Airborne WIA's and KIA's. The 3-508 must have been understrength. I heard that the 3-508 was deactivated in 1968 in Panama.

WORLD WAR I MEMORIAL RAO BULLETIN 15 SEP 2008


nine after than decades driving ambulances on the battlefields of Europe, 107vear-old Frank Woodruff Buckles is the nation's last known survivor of World War I. Now he's also become the face of an ambitious campaign to erect a national memorial honoring the 4.6 million Americans who endured "the war to end all wars." Buckles was the celebrity participant at a news conference 9 SEP to unveil plans for a National World War I Memorial on Washington's National Mall. It would be midway between memorials already there to World War II and the Korean War. Planners envision refurbishing and expanding an existing memorial that President Herbert Hoover dedicated in 1931 to honor World War I veterans from the District of Columbia. That circular open-air Doric structure. ravaged by time and neglect, is tucked among trees at the southern edge of the Mall and often is ignored or overlooked by tourists. It was named Washington's as one of most endangered places in 2003 and 2006.

Town of Grand Island, NY, has been proclaiming August 16th, as "National Airborne Day". The 82d Airborne Division flag is flown at Town Hall and DeGlopper Park in honor of PFC Charles N. DeGlopper, Medal of Honor recipient. The local VFW is also named in his Honor. He was a native son of Grand Island and his story is well known and kept alive in this area. He is interred in Maple Grove Cemetery on the Island.
