

### PAST CHAIRMAN JACK K. DAMRON BY KEN HAMILL

Past Chairman Jack Damron is Gone, but not forgotten. Lieutenant Colonel Jack Kenneweg Damron, US Army Retired passed away Sunday, April 12, 2009 at Tidewell Hospice House in Port Charlotte, Florida. Jack was an Infantry Officer who fought on Pork Chop Hill, Korea in 1952 with chapter member Clarence McCluskey of Oxford, CT. They served in L Co., 17th Inf Regt, 7th Infantry Division. Jack was CO

of HQ & B Co. 1 – 508 ARCT at Camp Wood, Japan 1955-56. Captain Damron was in Little Rock, Arkansas in 1957 and told Governor Faubus that his troops of the 327 ABG would escort the students into Central High School by order of the President. Jack also worked for and retired from Ohio State University. Jack was the second 508th Chapter Chairman and did that job extremely well for years. He was also the Secretary and Treasurer, Ken Glynn was Quartermaster and Rodger Jacobson was the Vice Chairman. He wrote our Chapter Newsletter, the Devils Digest six times each year and received numerous awards from

National for the newsletter. Jack created our Chapter Website and the Microsoft Access Database. Rodger Jacobson would send him new names and addresses and Jack would add them to his database. Personal information of over 3500 508<sup>th</sup> Airborne veterans was saved to the database. Jack thrived on hard work for the good of our Chapter until Hurricane Charlie hit Punta Gorda in August 2004. The Damron home was severely damaged. Major repair delays and contractor problems led to Jack's retirement as Chairman of the 508th Chapter. Jack and Ruth attended the 2007 Clarksville Reunion while he was fighting the melanoma. He had numerous surgeries plus radiation treatments on his face and neck. Jack's COL Tom Damron USA Retired brother. informed us of Jack's passing & arrangements. The Inurnment of Jack Damron with full military honors will be conducted at Arlington National Cemetery, Monday, August 3, 2009, starting at the Fort Myer Post Chapel at 11:00 AM.

Arthur W. Mahon of Navarre, Florida is looking for information of his past. Artie was brought up in Gealeton, PA, joined the Army and became a member of the 307th Engineers, 82nd Abn Div., was transferred to the 11th Abn Div at Fort Campbell, then on orders to the 508th ARCT while at the Repot Depot. Artie wrecked his 1949 black Hudson in Clarksville and went to the hospital, followed by 30 days convalescence leave. When he returned to Fort Campbell, he was asked if he wanted to return to Fort Bragg, he said yes and went back to the 82nd. Artie was discharged in 1956 and returned to PA. Does anyone remember Artie Mahon?

I Spoke to Robert S. Abenmoha of Harveys Lake, PA and Easy Company, 508 ARCT 1951-52. He got his high school diploma while in E Co. He remembers First Sergeant McClure. Was also assigned as Ranger School Cadre. He graduated from college and built a successful printing business. In May 2008 he received an Honorary Doctorate of Humanities from Misericordia University in Dallas, PA.

I heard from James L. Gallogly of Hampton, lowa and Love Company 508 ARCT 1951-54. Jim's wife Judy had five surgeries and a light stroke last year causing cancellation of their normal winter move to Sanford, Florida. Jim still riding his Harley with the Patriot Guard and usually makes bike week at Daytona.

Mrs. Thomas E. Francis sent notification of the loss of Tom on beautiful Support Company, 508 ARCT stationary with paratroopers depicted riding a troop train in Japan and our pocket patch. The envelope had a regimental crest on the back. Thank you Judy. She reported that Tom had his 508th cap and paratrooper wings with him when he left this earth as he wished.

I heard from Dr. Jim Jackson of Wichita, KS and Baker Company, 508 ARCT 1955-56. Doctor Jackson was recently selected to the Japanese College for Intravenous Therapy – International Advisory Committee, so he is paying them back for Camp Wood memories.

I spoke to Richard L. Dunn of Marshall, Michigan and B Company, 508 ARCT 1955-56. He remembers his Company Commander Walter Bodman, his First Sergeant Charles Clapper and Platoon Sergeant Dolph. Dunn remembers a C-47 jump when the plane hit some turbulence, a soldier projected vomit and several became queasy. Platoon Sergeant Dolph removed his steel pot from his helmet liner and vomited into it. Then dumped the steel pot's contents out the aircraft door and reassembled his steel pot back onto his liner. Editor: Ho Hum stuff for a veteran.

I heard from Charlie Haycock of New Smyrna Beach, Florida and HQ 3-508 Panama 1962-65. The October jump was cancelled but Liberty Jump Team did attend the reunion of the 440<sup>th</sup> Troop Carrier Group from WWII. They also had a dedication of a current C-130 to the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division. The nose art on the aircraft says "We put the air in Airborne"

I spoke to Ernest W. Skip Myler of Syracuse, NY and C Battery, 320th Airborne Field Artillery, 508th ARCT 1954-55. Skip was an active member of an Orienteering Club. They were timed at finding a series of objectives on the ground, double time, cross country using a military map. Skip competed in USMA Cadet Orienteering Club competitions at West Point. My 1981 Army Rifle Team Captain, Bill Schneider orienteered in the off season and probably competed with Skip. Bill Schneider is now a Federal Judge in the state of Maine.

# HOME MORTGAGE ABUSE TARGETS VETERANS

Tom Sahrmann of the 508 Chapter sent this message: It has come to my attention that a new abuse is appearing in the home mortgage business that is specifically targeted at veterans. Beginning in May 2009, veterans applying for mortgage loans will be required by "Banks" to pay for a conventional commercial appraisal (at a cost of approximately \$500) even though VA Mortgage rules specifically indicate a veteran does not have to pay this fee as it is included in the rate lock paid to the Bank. No other mortgage borrower other than veterans are being impacted by this "Bank" requirement. The following mortgage underwriting language is being used to implement this new assault on veterans: "In an effort to mitigate the risk of declining home values on VA IRRRL transactions, effective with new registrations and/or rate locks received on or after May 4, 2009, the following guidelines will apply:


- (1.) Obtain and deliver a conventional appraisal.
- (2.) Minimum of a 2055 exterior conventional appraisal is required.

- (3.) Any repairs that impact safety, livability, or habitability must be completed. The property condition must be rated "average" or better. The Bank does not accept ratings of "fair" or less. (4.) Confirm the total loan amount (total loan amount = base loan amount plus VA funding fee)
- (5.) Appraisal must meet all conventional appraisal requirements.

"in addition, effective with new regulations and/or rate locks received on or after Monday, May 4, 2009, the max CLTV on a VA cash-Out Refinance transaction will be limited to 90%."
