### **2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004 - THE COUNTDOWN BEGINS**

The 26<sup>th</sup> Annual Reunion of the 508th Parachute Infantry Regiment Association held in Kansas City, Kansas voted on August 27, 2000 to accept the recommendation of the Retirement Advisory Committee (RAC) to retire the ASSOCIATION in the year 2004 at Camp Blanding, Florida.

Plans for our 30<sup>th</sup> and Final Reunion were immediately set in motion.

Activated at Camp Blanding, Florida, the 508 attracted men strong of body and steadfast of mind who volunteered to serve their country for the noblest of causes.

In 1942, we were put to the test in the initial phases of our training under the leadership of a cadre of officers and non-commissioned officers at Camp Blanding who were second to none.

We were put to the test again at Jump School, Fort Benning, Georgia. Many fell by the wayside, but those of us who were fit to the task went on to earn our coveted Parachute Wings which we would wear with pride for years to come.

Camp Mackall and Tennessee maneuvers toughened us and forged us into a team of spirited infantrymen who were airborne all the way! Our combat record in Normandy, Holland, Belgium, the Ardennes and the Rhineland brought fame and many deserved honors to the men and officers of our regiment.

It is fitting that we should retire in a BLAZE of GLORY at Camp Blanding in 2004!

## UP-Date on Retirement of the Association

Norb Studelska, Chairman and "Rock" Merritt, Vice Chairman of the Retirement Advisory Committee (RAC) report successful completion of some of the 12 RAC Tasks. Task 2 chaired by Dr. John Hardie and his committee participated in the dedication of the Sergeant Leonard Funk Memorial at Camp Blanding on June 19, 1999. On the same day, DZ DIABLO was dedicated through the efforts of Bob Abraham.

Camp Blanding was chosen to be the permanent repository of the historical records, the colors and the memorabilia of the 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment Association 1942-1945.

The RAC Committee reports progress is being made on other Tasks, some of which are nearing completion.

One important Task has been assigned to the Company Reps, which involves the compilation of Company Albums to be archived in the Museum Library at Camp Blanding. These albums will serve as source materials for future historians.

RAC encourages participation by all companies in this worthy TASK.

## Retirement plans do not come Easy!

The Hamblin Committee worked four years (1994-1998) to lay the foundation and the groundwork for the on-going Association retirement program.

Originally known as the "Future of the Association Committee" with Past President, Paul Hamblin as Chairman and with help from Bob Abraham, George Stoeckert, and Ed Ott (who died on February 19, 1999) their four years of dedication and expertise gave rise to the present day Retirement Association Committee which continues their work.

## Action at Kansas City, Kansas

The general membership voted to validate the retirement date of the Association on or about October 20, 2004.

The average age of members of the Association is 77. In 2004 the majority of members will be in their eighties.

As membership declines and attendance at Annual Reunions dips precipitously, the ability of the Association to carry on effectively will decrease.

At each successive Reunion of the 508, members will be asked to vote whether to retain the 2004 Retirement date or to amend it, in accordance with Article IX, Section 4 of the Association Constitution and Bylaws.

It is presumed that the YEAR 2004 date will continue to be voted each year until the Association formally retires in grand and dignified style at Camp Blanding, the birthplace of the 508<sup>th</sup> Parachute Infantry Regiment.

**In the Footsteps of the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division**

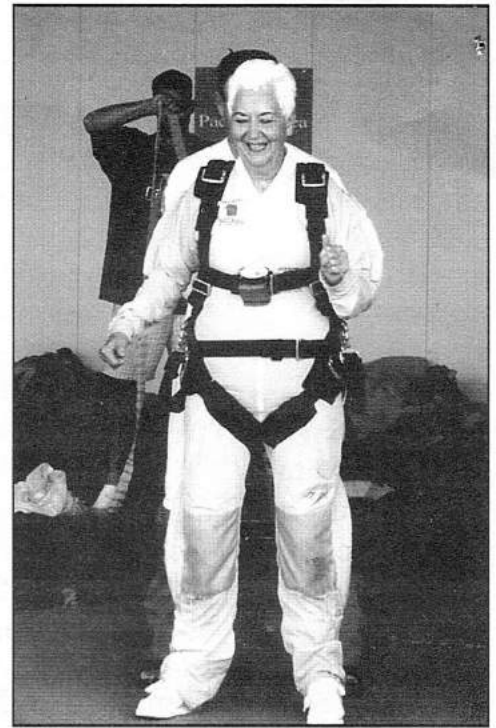

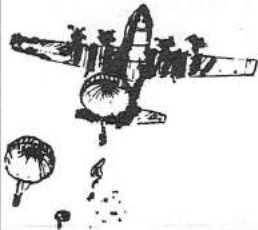
**EDITOR'S NOTE:** It has been my privilege to work with Zig for a few years. Our friendship has grown over time and I treasure every minute of it.

In his book the Devil's Tale, **Zig** has faithfully captured the spirit of the paratrooper and relates their stories "in their own words" The deeds and actions of the men of the 508 and their comrades are given flesh and blood by **Zig's** words and hence they are immortalized!

**Harry Lee Reisenleiter, (B)** married his wartime sweetheart, **Maxine** in 1946. He had jumped into Normandy on D-Day with the 508 PIR. He was a 50 year member of the American Legion. He often put on his jump jacket and paratrooper pants and boots and spoke at local schools on the history of WWII. Maxine told Harry that she would like to make a parachute jump. Harry said he'd enjoy it, too, especially since this time no one would be shooting at him. They never did it before Harry died in December 1998. Maxine often thought about making the jump. On Sunday, September 10, 2000 she made the jump in Sullivan, Missouri – 60 miles from St. Louis. Her son and daughter along with friends and relatives were there to watch. "I'm celebrating his 78<sup>th</sup> birthday", she said, "It's my way of remembering. I'm glad I did it."

**Thomas J.B. Shanley**, West Point, 1939 activated the 2<sup>nd</sup> battalion of the 508 PIR at Camp Blanding, Florida in October, 1942.

He led the 2<sup>nd</sup> Bn in Normandy, Holland and the Ardennes. After the war he continued to serve his country in a distinguished military carrier.

On the Normandy drop only 2 companies assembled under his command on the DZ set up by 3<sup>rd</sup> Bn Pathfinder Team under **Lt. Gene Williams**.

Outnumbered by a German Battalion, Tom Shanley recovered his wounded and set up defensive positions on Hill 30. There, his men fought enemy attacks for two days with dwindling ammunition and medical supplies.

**Colonel Shanley's** defiant stand on Hill 30 with his men has been credited by historians as a major reason for the success of the American Airborne effort in Normandy.
