Our **President**, **Bob Speers** reports on the Reunion site for 2002:

At the business meeting in Kansas City the members voted to hold the 2002 Reunion in Jackson Hole, Wyoming.

written proposal was received from the Ramada Express Hotel in Laughlin, Nevada, and, after review, it was accepted by the Board.

Laughlin is across the Colorado River from Bullhead City, Arizona. It is 50

miles southeast of **Las Vegas.** If you are driving it is 10 miles west of **Kingman**, **AZ**. Hotel rates are \$19.00 per room per night. With tax it comes to \$20.71 per night.

From the east, fly to Phoenix, AZ and take the air bus (737) to Bullhead City, where a courtesy van takes you directly to the hotel. The air-bus is \$99.00 round trip. The savings in room cost will more than offset the \$99.00 air fare.




OB Hill und Kameraden

Sprechen Sie Deutsch? All decked out in their Eisenhower jackets the intrepid five plan strategy for a BLITZ on the local Bierstube. OB is second from the right. Can you identify his buddies? Notice the Combat Infantryman's BADGE (CIB) on the left pocket lapel.

The photo above is taken from page 43 of the French Magazine, "Armes MILITARIA", issue No. 167, June 1999. The cover is to the right. I was in the square at Ste.-Mere-Eglise on June 6, 1999.. A Frenchman in his 40's approached me. I had never seen him before. He beckoned me to approach his car parked next to mine. Without a word, he reached into his car, took out this magazine and handed it to me. I had no idea what it was. I offered to pay him. He shook his head and said, "C'est pour vous." I shook his hand, thanked him for the magazine and we said "goodbye". It was not until much later in the day that I discovered the story of O.B. Hill.

"The impact when I hit the water was violent. I was sinking rapidly in the muddy current of the Douve. I couldn't move and the inescapable feeling of death seized my mind and my body. Finally, my feet touched solid ground and I stood up and pushed myself out of the water.

Suddenly a ray of hope — my mouth came up above the water!"

This is how O.B. Hill described his landing near Beauzeville-la Bastille in Normandy on D-Day, June 6, 1944 to Dominique Francois.

The five-page spread replete with maps and photos of memorabilia recounts the events of the first five days of combat of O.B. Hill and his comrades from Hq 1st Battalion of the 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment in Normandy.
