Tribute to O.B. Hill Founder and Permanent Chairman 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment Association



O.B. was known for his genuine smile. It radiated deep from within his generous heart. When he met you, he chuckled and asked, "How's the little woman?" Beneath the good-natured humor of the man was a well-spring of emotion. He had a deepseated respect for the men of the 508 who served beside him in Normandy. This became apparent when he talked about his Company Commander, Captain Gerard A. Ruddy who was killed in Normandy. In 1979 he visited Captain Ruddy's grave at the American Cemetery overlooking Omaha Beach. With O.B. was his comrade, Bill Goudy. They had served together in Headquarters Company, First Batallion. As they stood reading the inscription on Captain Ruddy's cross they talked about how his men would have followed him through the fires of Hell. "He was the finest man that I have ever met", said O.B.

The inspiration for forming the 508
Association came on that day in 1974.
"It was Captain Ruddy who made me do it", claimed O.B. "I started as soon as I got back to California.".

With names and addresses of five Hq 1st comrades, and a 30 year address book O.B went to work. He made phone calls, wrote letters, put notices in Veterans' magazines and a monthly notice in the Static Line. By July 1975 there were 227 names on the roster and the first reunion was held in Chicago, where 133 showed up. In 1982 a record 627 attended the reunion in Fayetteville, North Carolina to celebrate the 40th Anniversary of the Activation of the 508 PIR at Camp Blanding, Florida.

Since then, attendance at reunions has continued to decline, but our roster has now reached 1280. At the 27th Annual reunion in Tampa, Florida in 2001 there were 364 in attendance at the banquet.

Over the years, O.B and his wife Margaret have made many trips to England,
Normandy, the Netherlands and to Belgium.
Joe D. Hill accompanied his father on one of these tours of 508 Battlefields in Europe.
"He has been the Greatest Ambassador for the United States anyone could have," Joe says of his father.

O.B. was equally well known by the Airborne Community in the U.S. as the Chief spokes-person for the 508.

He was comforted during his final days by letters, cards and prayers from those who knew and loved him. On June 10, 2002, he breathed his last.

From George Stoeckert (HQ !st);
The Washington Post dated June 6, 2002
tells how Pretot, a village of 500 dedicated La
Place du Colonel Mendez as a tribute to
Colonel Louis G. Mendez who commanded the
3rd Battallion of the 508 Parachute Infantry
Regiment in the battle which liberated the little
village on June 20, 1944. Colonel Mendez
earned the Distinguished Service Cross, the
nation's second highest military honor for his
leadership in this action.

Jeannie Mendez, accompanied by eight of their twelve children, seven of the spouses and nine grandchildren were honored by the people of Pretot, both young and old, some of whom still had memories of that day on which they were liberated.

Among veterans of the 508 who had participated in the liberation of Pretot was Tom Porcella (H Co).

Dominique Francois a Historian who lives in Picauville, close to Pretot, has just published a book which recounts the history of the 508. Before he died, Colonel Mendez wrote the preface to the book.

Dominique, for many years a friend to men of the 508 who return to Normandy for the D-Day celebrations conceived the idea of commemorating Colonel Mendez.. He explained, "The people of Normandy are different from the Parisians. Here, the

Americans are venerated."

Dominique has been a frequent visitor to our 508 reunions. In Tampa he was the guest of Tom Porcella and Chet Graham.

Our 508 Paratroopers in the NEWS Charles J. Thompson (Service Co.) and his wife Janet.

Charles was guest speaker at the Fort Lee Officers Club on December 7, 2001 to observe the 60th Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. He recalled standing in line at 0755 hrs in the mess hall at Schoefield Barracks the moment the attack began. He was a heavy weapons platoon sergeant in M Company of the 27th Infantry Regiment. During the bombardment he manned a .30 caliber machine gun on the top of his barracks. It was his first taste of combat. "I'll never forget my Baptism of Fire', he told Colonel Mills, Director of the Advanced Officers Course and the guests at the banquet. In his remarks he described the carnage, his actions and what he observed during the 24-hour period following the Pearl Harbor attack. He reminded the officers that December 7, 1941 was truly a "Day that will Go Down in Infamy!" For the vivid account of his experiences Charles Thompson received a standing ovation.

The 508 Connection

Our own "Rock" Merritt was guest of the 1st Battalion 508 Parachute Infantry as they toured WWII battle sites in Normandy.
On April 12, 2002 he met them at Ste. Mere-

Eglise. The next day they made a jump on the DZ originally assigned for the June 6,1944 jump by the original 508. (Our 508)
As he watched the active duty 508 troopers, "Rock" recalled how he and his stick had missed that DZ 58 years ago.

After the jump he went with them to Hill 30, then to Hill 95 and to Hill 131.

As resource person, "Rock" gave the young paratroopers an eye-witness account of how the 508 of 1944 showed the 'right stuff' throughout their 33 days, without relief, in combat against the German forces.

You bet your paratrooper boots, these young fellows were impressed! "Rock" recreated a lot of history for them with his first-hand accounts. At a dinner hosted by the Mayor of Ste. Mere-Eglise, Mme. Edith Coueffin sang a song which she dedicated to O.B. Hill.

"Rock" asked her the name of the song. She said, "Ask O.B. – he'll know it, because every time I sing it O.B. cries."

Rounding out his tour of "temporary duty" with the 508 1st Battalion, Rock placed wreaths at the graves of Captain Ruddy and Private John Pavlick at the St. Laurent Cemetery.

He arrived home in Fayetteville on April 16. "A great trip! Enjoyed every moment of it."
