Paul Hamblin inducted into OCS Hall of Fame, Fort Benning, April 4, 2002

The Hall of Fame honors OCS graduates who have left an indelible mark upon the army and the civilian sector. Exceptional leadership and a dedication to public service distinguish inductees selected for the Hall of Fame.

Paul was commissioned a 2nd Lieutenant in 1943 upon graduating from the University of Delaware. As a qualified parachutist he made 105 jumps during his career. He joined the 508 during the Battle of the Bulge and continued with C company as Honor Guard for General Eisenhower at SHAEF Headquarters in Frankfurt, Germany.

From 1947 to 1957 he served 3 tours with the 82nd Airborne at Fort Bragg, NC. He earned 7 overseas bars for tours of duty in Korea and Vietnam. Colonel Hamblin retired in1971 after 28 years of military service. He was the recipient of many awards and military decorations, including the Silver Star Medal, the Bronze Star, and Purple Heart with 2 clusters.

Paul served as President of the 508
Parachute Infantry Regiment Association in 1994. As an original member of the Retirement Advisory Committee Paul continues to make contributions to the 508 PIRA.

Topping off a distinguished career on stage, Television and the movies, William Windom is a tour de force in the soon to be released WWII musical, "The Windbreakers".



He won an "Emmy" for the lead in his weekly TV series, My World and Welcome to It.
