Colonel Thomas J.B. Shanley is to be honored June 20, 2003 by the people and the Mayor of Picauville in Normandy. The road encircling Hill 30 will be named after Colonel

Shanley. A delegation of 20 or more friends and family members will accompany Lucille, wife of Colonel Shanley, to the dedication ceremony. Also in attendance will be Chet Graham and other 508 troopers from Headquarters Company, 2nd Battalion who were with the "Shanley- group" that fought off the advance of a German Battalion on Hill 30 for three days following the 508's airborne landing on DZ "N" on D-Day, June 6, 1944.

Colonel Shanley (West Point, 1939) was commander of the 2nd Battallion, 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment whose D-Day mission was to seize a bridge over the Douve River at Pont l'Abbé. Only two companies of the Red Devils assembled under Colonel Shanley - due to the scattered drop. One mile short of the bridge, the 200 men who had assembled with Shanley met strong German resistance. Gathering their wounded, Colonel Shanley set up defensive positions on Hill 30. For the next two days the Shanley group beat off strong German units which tried to overrun the main airborne drop zones. Isolated from supplies of food, dwindling amunition and medical necessities for care of the wounded, the men fought valiantly and successfully resisted the German advance.for three days.

In Gerard M. Devlin's book "PARATROOPER", he states, "Many historians have credited Shanley's defiant stand on Hill 30 as being one of the major reasons for the overall success of the American airborne effort in Normandy."

Irvington T. Shanley (Hq 2nd) writes:

"I received word from Dominique Francois that the June 20, 2003 date is firm. Colonel Shanley does not travel much anymore – he will not make the trip to Normandy."
