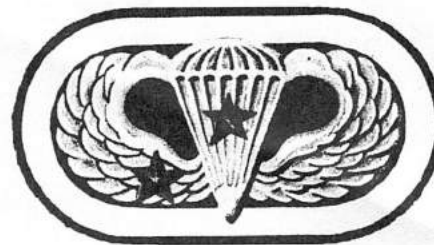

I had registered for the Awards Program. I wanted to be there to congratulate John on the spot, but Murphy's Law took a turn. My wife, Sally was admitted to the hospital on the 1st of April with double pneumonia. She came home on April 5th.

I had a nurse stay with Sally, then headed for Fort Benning. I had agreed to be the guest speaker at the airborne graduation ceremony on Thursday, April 10. When I got to Benning, I learned that the class of over 300 had not made one jump.

My speech was cancelled. The next day I drove back to Fayetteville to relieve the Nurse. I drove 800 miles for nothing.

My biggest regret is that I did not get to see "Doc" Hardie get his well-deserved Man of the Year Award.

I thank the members of our 508 association for the flowers and cards they sent for my Brother Gene's funeral.

I know that Brother Gene loved all the 508th association members. Over 30 e-mail messages of condolences were received. George Stoeckert, in his e-mail described how the 508th felt toward Brother Gene. George's e-mail was read at the Eulogy.

We lucked out on the honor guard for the burial ceremony. A retired Sergeant-Major in charge of the local VFW delegation gave Brother Gene full military honors, including a 21-gun salute.

I have signed the memorandum of agreement with the Officials at Camp Blanding. I will give a complete Report to the Board, the company reps and to the general membership at our reunion in Fort Mitchell, Kentucky this August.

Again, I want to congratulate Dr. John Hardie for being the 508th Man of the Year for 2003. We all know how much he has done for our association, as well as the many times he has attended to our sick at reunions and the long hours that he spent at the hospital caring for our members.

In closing, I wish all of you and your families a safe and a patriotic Fourth of July Celebration. Make it a great day for parades, picnics and outdoor barbeques.

The 508 accomplished their mission of blocking the advance of German troops toward the beaches , thereby assuring the breach of the Atlantic Wall by the invading ground troops coming by sea. David's speech got him thunderous applause.

Joseph L. Beasley, ("E" Co) died December 9, 2002 in St. Augustine, Florida. Obituary notice received from his wife, Virginia Haynes Beasley. He was buried with full military honors in Arlington National Cemetery. Born in Hinton, West Virginia, he was the youngest of 12 children. At the outbreak of World War II he was a student at Marshall University when he joined the U.S. Army. He was a master parachutist with the 82nd Airborne at Fort Bragg, N.C.

He retired as a Major in 1963 after 20 years in the military, including tours of duty in the Korean Conflict and Vietnam. He served with "E" company of the 508 Parachute Infantry Regiment as Staff Sergeant from 1943 to 1945. He was one of the earliest to join the elite 10th Special Forces under Colonel Aaron Banks in Bad Tolz, Germany. He is survived by his wife, Jinny, two daughters and two stepsons and one granddaughter.

Worster Miles Morgan, (HqHq) died March 17, 2003 in Dallas, Texas.

He jumped into Normandy with the 508th on D-Day, June 6, 1944. He also made the combat jump into Holland on September 17, 1944 with the 508 and saw action in the Battle of the Bulge where he was wounded by shrapnel and awarded the Purple Heart. He went with the 508 to Frankfurt-am-Main, Germany after VE Day when the Regiment was selected as Honor Guard to General Eisenhower at SHAEF Headquarters.

For his action in the Ardennes Campaign he was promoted to 2nd Lieutenant with a battlefield commission.

He retired from Mobil Oil Company after a career of 40 years in the oil industry.

He was active in his community and in his church. He enjoyed his work for the Lighthouse for the Blind and other charities.

He was deeply loved and will be sorely missed by his wife of 55 years, Lynn Sinclair Morgan and his daughters and their families.

Interment was at Hillcrest Memorial Park.

(Letter from Harry J. Kennedy: "Sergeant Morgan was NCO in the regimental S-2 section. Morgan's nickname was "Pappy". He was 28 years old - most of us were kids. I always said that "Pappy" was an exceptional leader and a fine human being".)
