POW BENEFITS

John Klein, B Co, is active in the American Ex-prisoners of War Association. He's adjutant and treasurer of the Fayetteville, Tarheel Chapter. The purpose of the Association is to help ex-POW's.

From small scale surveys and from general observation its known that ex POW's have a considerably higher incidence of cancer, ulcers, diabetes, heart trouble, arthritis and nervous disorders. They have tried to have the government recognize this through increased disability payments, but with no success. With increasing pressure from former POW's, Congress has finally authorized the VA to conduct a 2 year study of the increased medical problems and shorter life span of the POW's.

I talked with Stan Sommers, National Jr. Vice Commander of the American ex-POW's Association to see if we could help in any way. He says the VA will pick ex-POW's from their files at random and study their medical histories. This random sampling will give an unbiased picture of any problem. Right now you ex-POW's can help by joining and financially supporting a chapter of the ex-POW Association. There are 75 chapters nationwide. Stan Sommers of 1410 Adler Rd, Marshfield, Wis. 54449 can tell you of a nearby one. Or, join John Klein's Tarheel Chapter #1 P.O.Box 64801, Fayetteville, N.C. 29306
