Our hotel is right on the beautiful, sandy beach. It is newly redecorated. The Plaza has individually controlled air conditioned rooms with TV. It's features are endless: king size pool, sun bathing, shuffleboard, game room, tennis, basketball and a bus stop for all of the Central Florida attractions.

Come early and stay late. Daytona Beach is 60 minutes or less away from Disneyworld, Marineland, St. Augustine, Sea World, Cape Kennedy, Cypress Gardens and Silver Springs. Take a bus to these spots or rent a car.

It's a bargain rate so take advantage of it now. To be assured of a room and these special rates reservations must be in by June 1st.

The hotel takes all credit cards.
