A lot of you newer members may not know anything of our founder, O.B. Hill. He had the idea of getting the Regiment together for a reunion about 7 - 8 years ago. He started putting old addresses together and writing to people and soon ran into other 508ers with the same idea. Under his direction, addresses were pooled and contacts made for our first reunion in Chicago in 1975. It was very successful and the group decided to continue meeting with O.B. as Chairman.

We were lucky that we had a man like O.B. as the spark plug because he was able and willing to put lots of his own money and time into getting the organization started. It was really a love affair between him and the Association. He was site chairman, president, vice president, treasurer and secretary. We really took off and the second reunion hadeven more old 508ers turn up. It was here, though, that O.B. had his first heart attack. He scared the hell out of everyone. We also realized that if we were to continue as an organization he would require a lot of help. We made him permanent Chairman to oversee everything and arranged for president, vice president, treasurer, secretary and reunion chairman to be elected to keep the day to day things going. It's worked out well as we are now pushing 900 members.

O.B. and his wife Margaret live in El Segundo, Calif. He's now on a medical retirement from Howard Hughes Aircraft where he used to ply his trade as an accountant. Just ask him to add up a column of figures. He'll do it quicker in his head than you can do it by hand.

O.B. is a very active Chairman. His permanency gives us a continuity of direction and assures us a reference for advice. He arranges our overseas tours which so many have enjoyed. Every reunion chairman has seen O.B. fly in on his own to help with the early arrangements. We are lucky to have such an exuberant character on our side and it's no wonder he is called Mr. 508th. NORMANDY REMEMBERED

A very interesting letter was received from Dave Mondt a C-47 pilot of the 62nd Troop Carrier Squadron. He's secretary of their Association. His letter recalled their close relations with the 508th on D-day. Here's an interesting excerpt.

"I sent a copy of our June 44 Historical record to Robert E. Chisolm, also a copy of a navigators log for D-Day and the only load list that was ever retained by a pilot. James E. Able, Box 679, McKinney, Tx. 75069 was on that plane and contacted me and I put him in touch with the crew members. Able was in D Co, 3rd Plt. The 62nd on D-Day dropped Hq's and D Co, the rest of the 508th was delivered by the balance of the 314th and the 313th. Departed from Saltby and Folkingham. The navigators log shows take off time from Saltby at 23:25, and a drop time of 02:06 for the first nine aircraft over DZ N. I was flying in the second nine and recorded a drop time of 02:08, which would be about correct for the formation. Chisolm informed me that he exited at 02:07. Allowing for the possible difference in time pieces -- we all arrived at about the same time."
