MEDAL OF HONOR



5 September 1945. The President of the United States of America, in the name of Congress, takes pleasure in presenting the Medal of Honor to First Sergeant Leonard A. Funk, Jr. (ASN: 33070198), United States Army, for gallant, intrepid actions against the enemy on 29 January 1944, while serving with Company C, 1st Battalion, 508th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division, in action at Hozheim, Belgium. After advancing 15 miles in a driving snowstorm, the American force prepared to attack through waist-deep drifts. The company executive officer became a casualty, and 1st Sergeant Funk immediately assumed his duties, forming headquarters soldiers into a combat unit for an assault in the face of direct artillery shelling and harassing fire from the right flank. Under his skillful and courageous leadership, this miscellaneous group and the 3d Platoon attacked 15 houses, cleared them, and took 30 prisoners without suffering a casualty. The fierce drive of Company C quickly overran Holzheim, netting some 80 prisoners, who were placed under a 4-man guard, all that could be spared, while the rest of the under-strength unit went about mopping up isolated points of resistance. An enemy patrol, by means of a ruse, succeeded in capturing the guards and freeing the prisoners, and had begun preparations to attack Company C from the rear when 1st Sergeant Funk walked around the building and into their midst. He was ordered to surrender by a German officer who pushed a machine pistol into his stomach. Although overwhelmingly outnumbered and facing almost certain death, 1st Sergeant Funk, pretending to comply with the order, began slowly to unsling his submachine gun from his shoulder and then, with lightning motion, brought the muzzle into line and riddled the German officer. He turned upon the other Germans, firing and shouting to the other Americans to seize the enemy's weapons. In the ensuing fight, 21 Germans were killed, many wounded, and the remainder captured. 1st Sergeant Funk's bold action and heroic disregard for his own safety were directly responsible for the recapture of a vastly superior enemy force, which, if allowed to remain free, could have taken the widespread units of Company C by surprise and endangered the entire attack plan.

DISTINGUISHED SERVICE CROSS

22 January 1945. The President of the United States of America, authorized by Act of Congress, July 9, 1918, takes pleasure in presenting First Sergeant Leonard A. Funk, Jr. (ASN: 33070198), United States Army, for extraordinary heroism in connection with military operations against an armed enemy while serving with Company C, 1st Battalion, 508th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division, on 18 September 1944 in Holland. With great courage, intrepidity, and on his own initiative, Sergeant Funk led a three-men patrol against a German flak battery of three 20-mm guns which were firing on American gliders then circling to land. He drove off all enemy security around the guns and led an assault which killed approximately twenty members of the crews and inflicted other casualties. The flak guns were silenced before effective fire could be placed upon the aircraft, due to the courageous and heroic actions of Sergeant Funk. The courageous action of Sergeant Funk contributed, in large part, to the prompt seizure of his company objective, and assisted in driving the enemy from the landing zone. His initiative, outstanding bravery, and strong personal leadership, despite overwhelming enemy superiority in both numbers and firepower, enabled him to render a distinguished service in the destruction of enemy resistance. First Sergeant Funk's intrepid actions, personal bravery and zealous devotion to duty exemplify the highest traditions of the Army of the United States and reflect great credit upon himself, the 82nd Airborne Division, and the United States Army.

I VOLUNTEERED TO DO IT, KNOWING WELL THE HAZARDS OF MY CHOICE,
I SERVE IN A MIGHTY AIRBORNE FORCE—FAMED FOR DEEDS IN WAR,
—RENOWNED FOR READINESS IN PEACE, IT IS MY PLEDGE
TO UPHOLD ITS HONOR AND PRESTIGE IN ALL I AM—IN ALL I DO.
I AM AN ELITE TROOPER—A SKY TROOPER—A SHOCK TROOPER
—A SPEARHEAD TROOPER. I BLAZE THE WAY TO FAR-FLUNG GOALS
—BEHIND, BEFORE, ABOVE THE FOE'S FRONT LINE,
I KNOW THAT I MAY HAVE TO FIGHT WITHOUT SUPPORT
FOR DAYS ON END. THEREFORE, I KEEP MIND AND BODY ALWAYS FIT
TO DO MY PART IN ANY AIRBORNE TASK.
I AM SELF-RELIANT AND UNAFRAID. I SHOOT TRUE,
AND MARCH FAST AND FAR. I FIGHT HARD AND EXCEL
IN EVERY ART AND ARTIFICE OF WAR.
I NEVER FAIL A FELLOW TROOPER. I CHERISH AS A SACRED TRUST
THE LIVES OF MEN WITH WHOM I SERVE. LEADERS HAVE MY FULLEST
LOYALTY, AND THOSE I LEAD NEVER FIND ME LACKING.
I HAVE PRIDE IN THE AIRBORNE! I NEVER LET IT DOWN!
IN PEACE, I DO NOT SHRINK THE DULLEST OF DUTY NOT PROTEST
THE TOUGHEST TRAINING. MY WEAPONS AND EQUIPMENT
ARE ALWAYS COMBAT READY. I AM NEAT OF DRESS
—MILITARY IN COURTESY—PROPER IN CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR.
IN BATTLE, I FEAR NO FOE'S ABILITY, NOR UNDER-ESTIMATE HIS PROWESS,
POWER AND GUILF. I FIGHT HIM WITH ALL MY MIGHT AND SKILLS
—EVER ALERT TO EVADE CAPTURE OR ESCAPE A TRAP.
I NEVER SURRENDER, THOUGH I BE THE LAST.
MY GOAL IN PEACE OR WAR IS TO SUCCEED IN ANY MISSION
OF THE DAY—OR DIE, IF NEEDS BE, IN THE TRY.
I BELONG TO A PROUD AND GLORIOUS TEAM—
THE AIRBORNE, THE ARMY, MY COUNTRY.
I AM ITS CHOSEN PRIDE TO FIGHT WHERE OTHERS MAY NOT GO
—TO SERVE THEM WELL UNTIL THE FINAL VICTORY.
I AM THE TROOPER OF THE SKY!
I AM MY NATION'S BEST! IN PEACE AND WAR I NEVER FAIL.







508th PIR Normandy Riggers

The twenty 508th PIR Riggers who jumped into Normandy, France, in the early morning hours of D-Day, June 6, 1944, may well have been a microcosm of the chaos that briefly ensued when the 82nd and 101st Airborne troops were scattered widely (and wildly) over the Cotentin Peninsula. The drop also demonstrated the resilience, ingenuity and courage of the American Paratrooper - ***traits properly attributed to our airborne brethren to this day.***

When the two C-47s, carrying 20 Riggers and 16 other Paratroopers, dropped our Sticks, we were north of Valognes, roughly 20 miles from the intended Drop Zone. Worse still, according to Phil Nordyke in his book "Put Us Down In Hell", we landed "...almost on top of the headquarters of Battalion 1, Grenadier Regiment 1058, 91st Luftlande Division of Le Haut Gelay". I can personally attest to the German presence because, after disengaging from a tree landing, I was met by a harsh "Hande Hoch" and a rifle and two burp guns pointed at my belly.

It is a testament to the courage and ingenuity of the American Troopers that, of those captured (some not yet out of their parachute harnesses), two were wounded, two made a daring escape, and three engineered a breakout so that a group of 13 paratroopers and 4 glidermen could turn the tables on their captors. We then marched the Germans to Utah Beach thanks to the 4th Division's successful penetration and establishment of a presence on/at the beach. Two more days and nights, two more German prisoners, a large can of stewed tomatoes, and an uncertain scrabble through a dangerous countryside, and we finally found "our guys" near Chef du Pont. We weren't "home free" by any means...but we were home as far as we were concerned.






